Director, Central Texas Angel Network, Ultratech (UTEK)

Rick is a resident of Austin, Texas on three separate occasions since 1975 and is heavily involved in the Austin start-up community. He is a member of the Central Texas Angel (CTAN) where he is the Chairman of the Board. He has personally

invested in over 20 Austin start-up companies. He brings with him 35 years of experience in financial management and strategic guidance from two Fortune 100 technology leaders. Most recently, Rick served as vice president and Corporate Controller of finance at networking technology leader Cisco Systems. There he was instrumental in developing and implementing an e-culture of financial reporting across all of Cisco's worldwide operations. When he arrived in 1996, Cisco took two weeks to close its quarterly books. Under his leadership, the task was reduced to 4 hours.

Prior to Cisco, Rick served as vice president of finance for Motorola, where he had worldwide financial responsibility for the Semiconductor division. He also was the VP of Finance for Motorola Japan and lived in Tokyo for 6 years in developing Motorola's cellular operations in Japan, which experienced explosive growth from \$300 million to over \$2 billion. In addition to his operational experience, Rick has also worked with numerous top tier venture firms from across the country.

Rick is also a former Board member in four public companies, five privately held companies and four non-profit organizations. Rick holds a B.S. degree in accounting and finance from the University of Arizona, an M.B.A. degree from St. Edward's University, and was previously a Certified Public Accountant.

Previously, Lynn Atchison served as the Chief Financial Officer of HomeAway, Inc. (AWAY) from August 2006 until March of 2016. During her tenure the business grew from about \$10 million in revenue

to over \$500 million. She was responsible for managing all financial aspects of the company. She has over 30 years of finance and operations experience, including expertise in financial management and reporting, securities filings, facilities management and legal and human resources. She was instrumental in the sale of the company to Expedia in 2016.

Prior to HomeAway, Atchison was CFO of Infoglide Software, where during her tenure revenue grew more than 160 percent. Likewise, in her positions as senior vice president and CFO at Hoover's Online, Atchison helped lead the business from a private to a publicly-owned company, increasing revenues by ten times which ultimately resulted in the sale of the company to Dun & Bradstreet in 2003.

She has also served as vice president and CFO for Travelogix Inc., as a senior manager for Ernst & Young LLP and spent time in private practice.

She is currently serving as vice chair of the Austin Technology Council (ATC) since February 2015 and has served on the ATC board since April 2012. Lynn is a member of original steering committee for Women@Austin since the fall of 2013. Women@Austin is a mission-driven community with one raison d'être: to advance women entrepreneurs in Austin. She is a director of RealMassive (Austin Texas) since November 2015 and also a director of Speed Commerce ("SPDC" Dallas, Texas) since October 2013.

Atchison holds a bachelor of business administration degree in accounting from Stephen F. Austin University. Also, while at the university, she was a member of the SFA cheerleaders of 1979-80 who established "the axe" hand symbol, the traditional spirit symbol for students, faculty and alumni.
